We believe that any child who has the ability to recover from autism should have the opportunity and tools to do so. We believe that every child should have a bright future to look forward to.


JOIN OUR COMMUNITY

The Autism Recovery Foundation was created as a non-profit in 2009 by a group of parents and advocates who saw the challenges faced by families seeking treatment for their young children with autism.

We believe that every child and family affected by autism has the right to timely effective treatment delivered by trained professionals.

The Foundation has three primary objectives:

1. To raise funds to help families with some of the costs of having a child with autism.
2. To increase the workforce of qualified treatment professionals.
3. To advocate and promote public awareness of the effectiveness of early intervention and treatment.



The Facts:

- 1 in 59 children has a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder.
- Early Intensive Behavioral Intervention (EIBI) can help many children with ASD live full and independent lives.
- EIBI can cost families \$60,000 to \$100,000+ per child, per year.
- While Minnesota has some of the highest-quality professionals serving kids with ASD, we need thousands more people in the workforce to meet the demand.

OUR IMPACT

BUILDING THE WORKFORCE

Since 2014 Autism Recovery Foundation has given away more than \$50,000 in scholarships to graduate students in the field of Applied Behavior Analysis.



OF THE 33 STUDENTS WE'VE SUPPORTED:

29 are working with individuals with autism or other developmental disabilities.

11 continue to pursue graduate school in autism-related programs.

15 have become Board Certified Behavior Analysts.

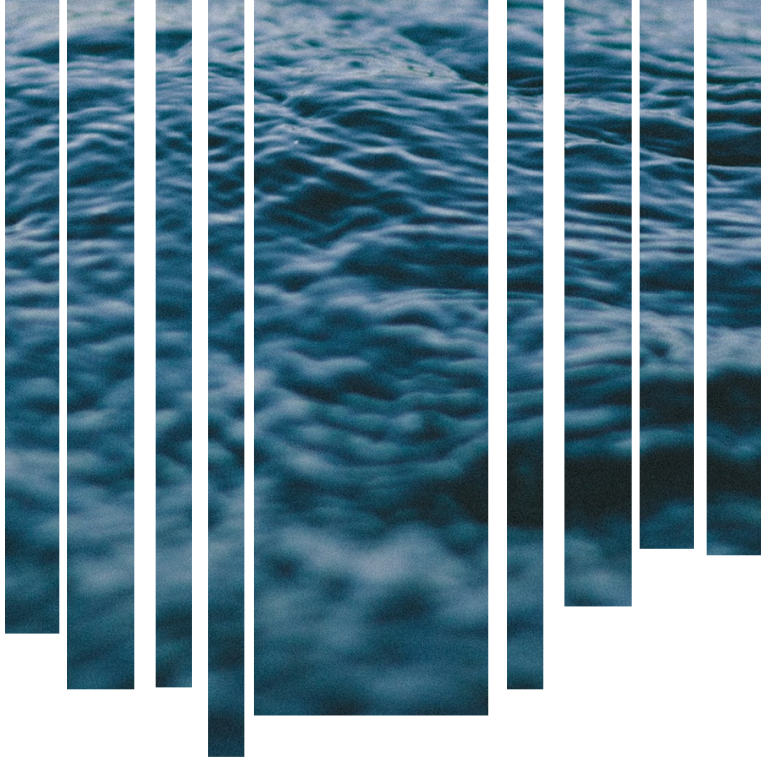


HELPING FAMILIES ON THE FRONT LINES

In 2017 ARF awarded Canteen Grants to 7 families on the front lines of autism

These grants up to \$500 help families to put the necessary pieces of their child's treatment together by paying for expenses like:

- THERAPY MATERIALS
- TRANSPORTATION COSTS
- COMMUNICATION TOOLS
- GPS TRACKING DEVICES
- SUMMER CAMP TUITION
- RESPITE CARE
- SOCIAL SKILLS GROUPS AND MORE.

Employee Engagement Opportunities

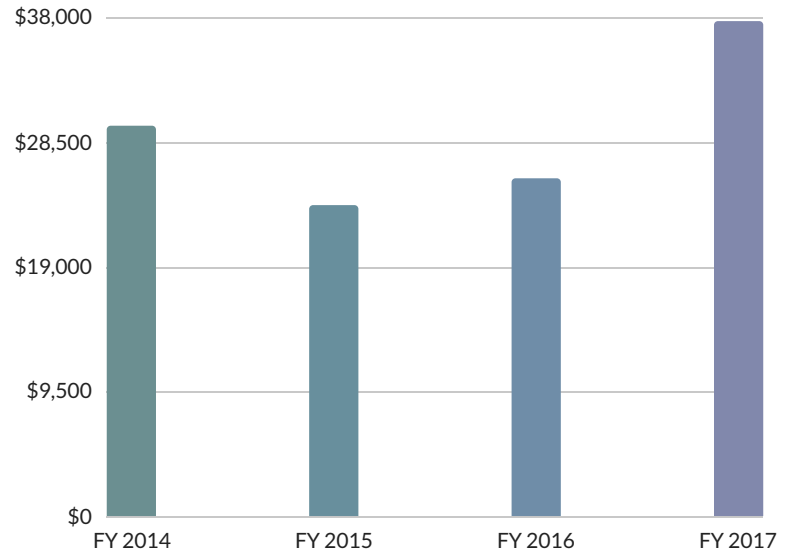

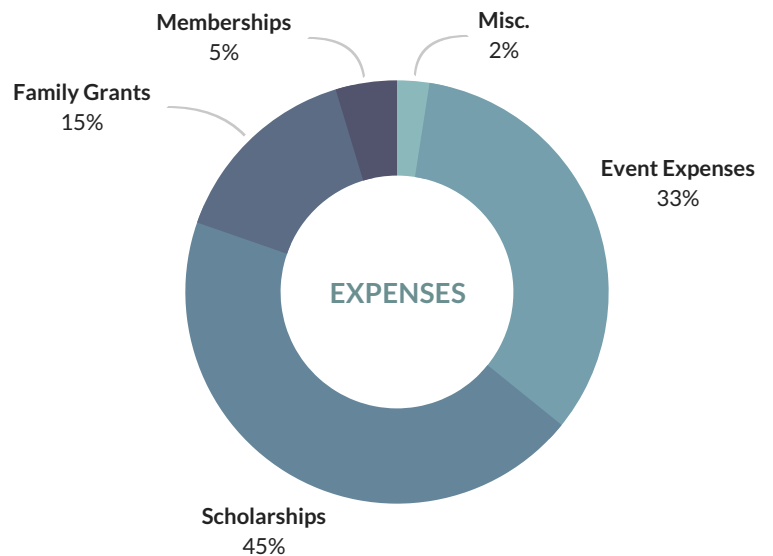
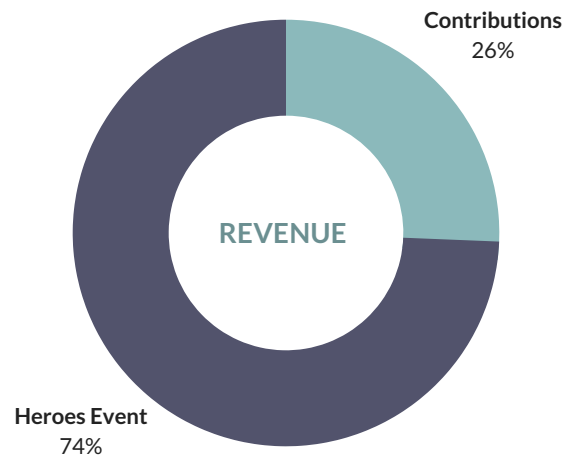
